The Donum Collection unveils its newest commission, Apollo of Belvedere by Adam Parker Smith

SONOMA, California (9 February 2023): Donum, one of California's leading Pinot Noir producers, is delighted to unveil its new commission, *Apollo of Belvedere* (2022) by Adam Parker Smith (USA, 1978). Alongside the acquisition, Donum reveals its new interactive art map that presents the collection that can be accessed via this link.

Apollo of Belvedere joins over 50 works of paintings and monumental, open-air sculptures at the Donum Collection, one of the largest accessible, privately-owned outdoor sculpture experiences in the world. Measuring two by two meters and weighing 18 tons, the Carrara marble cube is installed on a grey marble plinth where the rolling terrain of Donum's 200-acre Estate nestled between the Napa and Sonoma wine regions. The sculpture is located on the path towards Donum's eucalyptus grove, the setting adjacent to the recently unveiled *Vertical Panorama Pavilion*, a new pavilion by Studio Other Spaces - the office founded by Olafur Eliasson and Sebastian Behmann.

Mei and Allan Warburg, Owners of The Donum Estate, noted, "We are thrilled to expand The Donum Collection with Adam's work. It was striking when we first saw the maquette for the piece – familiar but bizarre. How Adam has re-interpreted an acclaimed classical work from the canon into a remarkable contemporary cube-like structure is phenomenal. Through working with artisans, digital modelling programs, and historic and modern carving tools, the process of fabrication is immaculate. We have commissioned many artists across varying mediums, often featuring figurative subjects, and until now, a marble work has not yet been featured on the estate. It is a beautiful addition to the collection and a contemporary nod to classical sculpture. We hope that Adam's piece will enrich the experience of all who come to enjoy Donum's unique fusion of fine wine and monumental art."

Adam Parker Smith commented, "Apollo Belvedere is a celebrated ancient statue. By compressing it into a compact cube, the sculpture raises questions on how we view and connect with classical objects and imagery. This new creation imagines subverting an icon of

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classical statuary by placing it through a trash compactor. This interrupts the viewer's usual perception of the iconic sculpture and creates a false sense of alienation while undermining the veneration we have for artworks from antiquity. In reshaping the visual experience of Apollo Belvedere, I hope to contribute to the discussion surrounding the continuous review of antique objects. It is a privilege to join such a broad range of leading artists that form The Donum Collection."

Donum prides itself on the careful placement of artworks throughout the estate. It takes into consideration the land, the seasons, and the necessary preparations to protect both the art and Donum's environment, which includes a state-of-the-art winemaking facility and a living farm.

Angelica de Vere Mabray, Donum Chief Executive Officer, added, "For the past two decades, our passionate Donum team has been committed to our mission of producing the finest Pinot Noir in California. Yet we are also custodians of the Donum Collection. *Apollo of Belvedere* is a monumental creation that traverses the classical and contemporary. It is a meaningful contribution to the Donum Collection, which offers unexpected and extraordinary encounters with art throughout the Estate. We are excited to feature it along with other new monumental sculptures and the newly opened pavilion wine tasting experience."
